"Having an Open Mind"

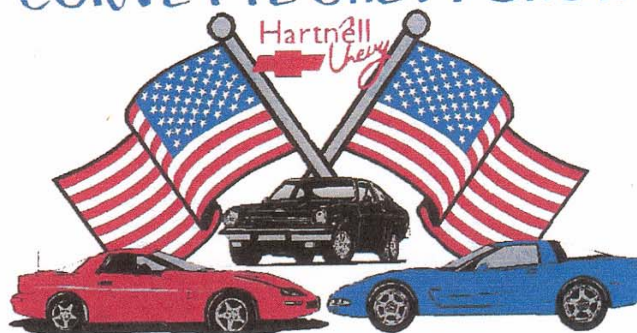

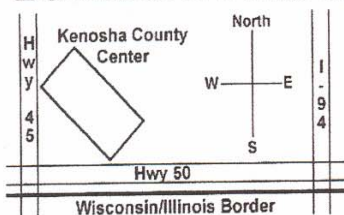
