- Prime Rib - \$17.95**
[Slow roasted 9 oz. slice served with aujus]
- Honey Mustard Chicken - \$15.95**
[2-6 oz. grilled boneless breasts topped with a honey mustard sauce]
- Stuffed Chicken Breast - \$15.95**
[Boneless breast of chicken stuffed and rolled with spinach and feta cheese and baked, topped with parmesan-mornay]
- Chicken Marsala - \$15.95**
2 – 6 oz. breasts lightly floured then sautéed and deglazed with Marsala wine, caramelized onions and mushrooms served over fettuccine]
- Atlantic Cod - \$15.95**
[7 oz. cod loin seasoned with white wine, butter and chef seasonings, baked to a flaky tenderness]
- Door County Walleye - \$15.95**
[2 – 5oz. walleye filets lightly breaded, than fried to a golden brown, served with homemade tartar sauce]

Prices include salad with house vinaigrette and rolls. Your choice of baked, mashed, roasted red potatoes, rice pilaf, parsley buttered noodles and

vegetable. Add one dollar per person for dessert.
