## **Secretary's Corner**

### **If Your Garbage Smells**

Put a cotton ball, soaked in clove or orange essential oil, into the bottom of the trash bin or container. It will help to make it smell somewhat better.

### **When Making Grilled Cheese in the Microwave**

To keep the toast crisp, place the sandwich on an inexpensive paper plate or paper towel before zapping it. These will help to absorb moisture.

### **Using Leftover Hamburger or Hot Dog Buns**

Don't throw them out. Instead, transform them into garlic bread. Spread with olive oil or butter and sprinkle with garlic salt or powder. Put under the broiler until toasted.

### **Cleaning Lightly Soiled Wallpaper**

Slightly dirty wallpaper or spots on nonwashable wall covering can be removed by rubbing the stains with a crumpled up slice of white bread.

### **Easy Minute Hot Cocoa**

In a mug, put 4 teaspoons hot chocolate mix, 1/2 to 1 teaspoon nondairy creamer (your favorite flavor), sugar or artificial sweetener (to your taste). Fill mug with boiling water and stir.

### **Toothbrushes Good Cleaning Tools**

Keep extra, new toothbrushes in the kitchen. They can be used to clean the handles of pots and pans, the coffee filter, the teeth of dirty forks, the rim of the stove and the handles of the oven or refrigerator.

### **Dry Powder Roach Recipe**

If you have a roach infestation, mix equal parts of boric acid powder and flour, cornmeal or sugar. Put in small lids in the affected areas (keep away from pets and children). Roaches will walk through and eat the mixture when they clean their feelers and legs and then die.

### **To Keep Rice From Sticking**

Spray the sides and bottom of the pot with nonstick vegetable spray before you add the water or rice. It will help prevent the rice from sticking.

### **Make Your Own Teriyaki Sauce**

Mix together 5 ounces soy sauce, 2 ounces sesame oil, 3 cloves of crushed garlic, 1 teaspoon ginger, 1 teaspoon dry mustard and 1 tablespoon molasses. Put into a bowl and serve on your favorite food.

### **Cleaning Shish-Kebab Skewers**

After removing cooked food, push skewers through a soap-filled steel wool pad before putting into water. It will loosen the gunk and make washing them much easier.

### **Storing Chocolate for Cooking**

Keep it wrapped in a cool, dry place away from heat and light. Be aware that odors (other smelly food, etc.) can ruin chocolate too. You can store chocolate in a cool cupboard or refrigerator for about a year.

### **Making French-Fried Onion Rings**

Here's an easy and quick idea: Make the batter from a prepared pancake mix. Dip the onion rings into it and then deep fry.

### **Cinnamon Toast Twist**

To jazz up cinnamon toast, put a bit of fine-ground instant coffee into the cinnamon and sugar mix for a coffee toast. Also, try adding granulated orange drink with sugar to sprinkle on buttered toast.

### **Cleaning Lime Deposits from Glass Vase**

Fill the vase with hot water and then put several denture tablets in it. Allow to soak for several hours and scrub with a bottlebrush. Rinse well and let dry.

### **Spiffing Up Chrome Faucet Handles**

Sudsy water and buffing dry usually cleans them. But if they're still not clean, sprinkle baking soda on a sponge and rub the area, then rinse and buff dry.

### **Homemade Steak Sauce**

Mix 1 cup of ketchup with 1 cup of Worcestershire sauce. This is good to baste on meat or chicken. Store in the refrigerator for several weeks.
